Dates: June 26th – July 1st – Location: Hope College, Holland, MI – Total Cost: \$365.00

What is MOVE?

Move is a 5-day high school only event held all over the country, designed to amplify the call of Christ on students' lives to become kingdom workers. It is a full week of great worship, cool speakers, small group studies & opportunities to build relationships with students in our high school ministry. It doesn't matter where you are in your journey; there is something for you at move.

What is a Kingdom Worker?

We believe that God has called everyone to use their talents, gifts, and their sphere of influence to advance the Kingdom of God (Kingdom Worker). MOVE is about equipping and empowering High School students to do what God has called them to do and be who God has called them to be when they get home from the week.

What are the sleeping arrangements?

We will be sleeping in college dormitories. High School student's will stay with other High school students in our groups in rooms of 2 and/or 3. There will be a dorm for guys and a dorm for girls.

What is the adult supervision like?

We will have adult leaders on all the buses and in the dorms with students. At the conference, students will be divided into C-Groups with leaders for each group and gender.

How much extra money does my student need?

You will need \$25-30 for 2 travel meals and one meal while we are at the conference. Students can also bring money for the coffee shop, snacks, MOVE gear, and offering if they want.

How do you get to MOVE?

We will be taking charter buses.

How do you determine room assignments?

Your student will have the opportunity to request 1 roommate, we do our best to accommodate all the requests. We try to room students with someone who is in their C-Group. All the rooms for a C-Group will be located next to each other.

Can my student bring a friend who doesn't go to FIRST?

Yes! We want all of our students to bring a friend with them. MOVE is a great event to bring friends.

What's the daily schedule?

Breakfast, Main Session, Small Group, Lunch, Electives, Free Time, Dinner, Main Session, Small Group, Sleep

What are the rules?

We ask that you respect the authority of our adult leaders, MOVE staff, Hope college staff and other students.

Please sleep in your assigned room for safety and security purposes.

Clothing should be a respectful and an appropriate representation of the environment that we are going to be in (An adult leader could ask you to change if it is seen as inappropriate).

Here are a couple non-negotiables:

Girls are not allowed in guys dorms or rooms and guys are not allowed in girls dorms or rooms.

Students cannot leave the campus without an adult leader.

You are not allowed to have drugs, alcohol, tobacco, fireworks, or weapons of any kind.

Guy and Girl wonder-offs are prohibited (we do not want a guy and a girl to wonder off somewhere by themselves).

There is no bullying, hazing or pranking other students or adult leaders.

All students must be in their dorms and rooms by the assigned curfew times.

We do reserve the right to immediately send a student home at the parent or guardian's expense.

What should I bring?

You should bring one suitcase/bag, one carry on, bedding, and a box fan.

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Suitcase packing suggestions:

Clothing for 4 morning sessions and activities (athletic, casual).

Clothing for 5 evening session (casual High School Oasis attire, something you would wear to school) and it can get cool at night.

Clothing for 2 travel days (Monday morning and Saturday morning).

Toiletries: bath towel, washcloth, makeup, blow dryers, razors, deodorant, soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, and anything else you can think of.

Bedding: We will be in the dorms on beds, but we need to provide our own twin-sized bedding (sheets, blanket and pillow or sleeping bag and pillow).

Other Optional things: Athletic equipment for free time (basketball, frisbee, etc), playing cards, or board games.

Carry on/Backpack suggestions:

Hoodie or Jacket for the bus

A water bottle

Your travel meal money and extra spending money

Bible, Journal, Pen

What is there to do during the free time?

During the free time there will be organized tournaments put on by the MOVE staff (3 on 3 basketball, volleyball, ultimate Frisbee, dodge ball) that students can sign up to participate in or watch.

There is a rec center that students will have access to and it does have a swimming pool (One-piece swimming suits for girls).

There is a street connected to the campus with coffee shops, ice cream, and restaurants that students will be allowed to visit with an adult leader.

They will have access to their dorm room if they want to nap or just hangout with other friends.

Are there scholarships available?

There are scholarships available. We have a scholarship application form that needs to be filled out and turned into the church office or student pastor. We do ask that all students do their best to get in the \$150 deposit.

What are Next Steps after MOVE?

Baptism:

What does it mean to give your life to Jesus?

- Commitment: We are making a commitment to live our lives for Jesus and to let him lead us. (John 14:5-6; Romans 3:22)
- Confession: I am a sinner in need of the Grace of Jesus. (Romans 3:23; Romans 10:9-10)
- Connects: Baptism connects us to the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. (Romans 6:3-5)
- Continually: My relationship with Jesus doesn't stop with my decision to be baptized. (Acts 2:42; 1 Timothy 4:7; 1 John 2:5-6)

While at MOVE we will have an elective class for everyone who is interested in baptism.

We will be doing baptisms when we return on Sunday night, July 2nd after the High School service in the Oasis.

C-Groups:

Sundays, 6:00-8:30P – July 9th–August 27th

C-Groups will resume during the summer on Sunday nights after the High School Oasis service.

C-Group Kick-Off – Wednesday, August 30th in the Oasis, 6:30-8:30P.

Wednesdays, 6:30-8:30P – Beginning September 6th

C-Groups are our mid-week programming for High School students. Groups meet at various homes and snacks are provided. Join other students from your high school campus for a time of Bible study, accountability, and service projects. Feel free to start attending at any time. We offer a campus group in Mahomet, Urbana, Champaign, Monticello, and Tolono.
