[QUICK REVIEW]

[MY STORY]

Conversations with people we love are sometimes great and at other times they are boring. There are always those conversations we look forward to but also those we dread. The same is true with communication with God. What has been your primary experience with prayer? What are some of the most encouraging answered prayers? [DIGGING DEEPER]

One of the things we talked about in this week's message was the idea that our phones and digital devices are often a distraction from keeping our attention on Jesus.
