Read Paul's sermon to the Jews in Acts 13:16-50. One of the things we learned about in this week's message was how the Jews seemed to have the right *orthodoxy* or *right belief*. However, the following week, when it was put into practice, they refused and opposed the message! Another way to put this was their *orthopraxy* or *right behavior* didn't match up. Between *orthodoxy and orthopraxy, is there one you find yourself leaning towards in your faith and discipleship journey?* Mark on the scale below where you might place yourself.
