As mentioned above, Stephen set a great example of Christ-likeness. When we place our faith in Jesus we are making a commitment with our life. A relationship with Jesus demands action. We are to be "like Christ." *Read Galatians 2:20 and Matthew 7:24-29* and explain in your own words what it means to be like Christ.

As we pursue growth in our faith, we can count on the fact that Satan will do anything and everything he can to prevent that growth from happening. Why? Because according to John 10:10 he comes to steal, kill, and destroy. We have all faced roadblocks or different challenges in our life. What do you see as the potential roadblocks in your own life to strive to be like Christ?
