[QUICK REVIEW]

Looking at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time or something that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

[MY STORY]

This week we talked about discipleship to Jesus being an apprenticeship under him where we are *with* Him the entire way. We've probably all had various bosses for various jobs throughout the years. *What are some of the best bosses you've had and why? What makes you want to work for them? How do you imagine Jesus being as a boss?*

[DIGGING DEEPER]

One of the things we learned about Jesus' way in Matthew 4 this week was that his posture towards disciples and therefore us is one *not* of obligation but of <u>invitation</u>. *How does that make you feel?*

The first invitation of Jesus in Matthew 4 is to "follow me"—to **Commune** with Him—or even more simply, **to be with him** on the road. The best way to think about this idea of *being with Jesus* is to think of a relationship with a dear friend or spouse or family member. You have intentional rhythms and habits of being with them over time that strengthen your relationship with them. *What are some of your intentional habits and rhythms of being with Jesus in your daily life? What are some small steps in a new direction you are feeling prompted to take to be with Him?*

Another invitation of Jesus in Matthew 4 is to become "fishers of people"—to **Contribute** to His Mission—to do what he would do if he were you throughout your life. Jesus wants to build His Kingdom through your life! What are some of the ways that you are contributing to the Mission of Jesus in your life? What are some ways you are feeling prompted to begin doing so?

The invitation that runs through each of these two things in Matthew 4—to Commune and Contribute—is that Jesus declares, "*I will make you* …into fishers of people." We are **changed by Him**, ultimately, in order *to become like Him*. Read John 15:1-17. List out all of the ways below that Jesus uses the metaphor of the Vine and branches to describe, communing, contributing, and being changed.

What is the prayer of your heart this week as you wrap up your time with this Discussion Guide?
