[DIGGING DEEPER]

In this weekend's message, Eric unpacked the idea of perseverance in our faith. We persevere in our faith not for a greater standing before God but rather a greater understanding of Jesus. This means that to know Jesus is the greater reward. What comes to mind when you think about having a greater understanding of Jesus? What does it look like in your life?

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In Philippians 3, Paul leaves no room for boasting in our own accomplishments. If anyone had a right to boast in personal accomplishments it was Paul but he considers all of it a "loss" and "garbage" compared to knowing Christ. So, what is the difference between boasting in ourselves versus boasting in Christ? How do we do that without sounding prideful? 2 Corinthians 10:12-18

When we study the life of Christ, we see Him persevering through great trials. So, to persevere in our faith is to be like Christ. *Read* the following two passages and write out observations of the similarities and differences in the perseverance of Jesus, despite what he was facing.

Matthew 4:1-11 & Matthew 26:36-45

What do you see as the differences between trials and temptations? **Read and use James 1:2-18** as a backdrop for understanding.
