Think about the *humility* it took to become human, live on this earth, and then die a death on the cross you did not deserve! One does not accomplish that without supernatural humility! I think it's safe to say that humility looks good on everyone and we look more like Jesus as we seek to humble ourselves before God. *C.S. Lewis, 'humility is not thinking less of yourself, rather thinking of yourself less.' Explain how this applies to the life and actions of Jesus.*
