In this weekend's message, we talked about the culture of compromise. There is a tension that exists here. Yes, we are going to be influenced by culture, but we don't have to live like a hermit and avoid culture altogether. At the same time, in a relationship with Jesus, there is no room for

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compromise. Being influenced by culture does not justify sin that might be a part of your life because of culture. **Read Romans 12:1-2 and John 15:18-19.** What does the tension described here practically look like in your life? How do you avoid being conformed by the "patterns of the world" yet maintain relationships for the sake of the gospel?

What detriment does compromise play in your personal faith? What detriment would compromise have in the church?
