[DIGGING DEEPER]

During the time of ancient Israel, the family was central to life. It was common for many generations to live in the same home together for their entire lives. Early on in Scripture, we are introduced to the preeminent passage for the people of God, called the *Shema*. **Read the** *Shema* below and note what jumps out to you about this passage.

Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. [a] 5 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. 6 These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 8 Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 9 Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.

Why do you think God chose verses 4 and 5 to be the cornerstone passage for His people?

How might you go about "impressing" loving God with one's heart, soul, and strength into your own life?

One of the most influential phrases out there is: (Examples) are caught more than they are taught! Explain how this applies to the role of being a parent? (whether biologically, adoptive, spiritually, etc.)
